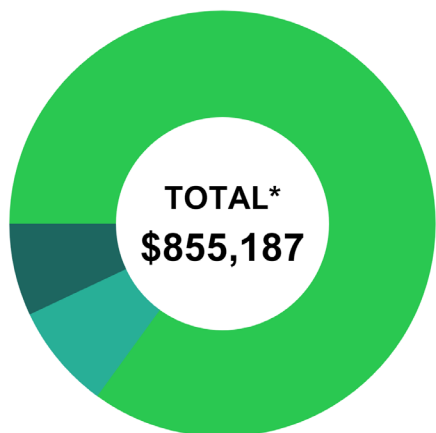
# FINANCIAL Transparency

Your commitment allows us to build up our assets and plan significantly increased investments in community programs. We thank you!

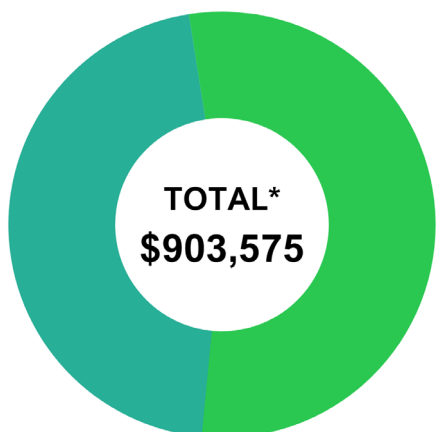
*Donor Dollars support: 92% Programs 8% Administration*

# Weighing and World-Changing

**A** long walk outside of Mzimba, Malawi, is the small village of Champeta. At the beginning of each month, this community comes together to uplift the health of children and the empowerment of women. Mothers awaken early, ready themselves and their children under age five, and must remember to bring their “Road to Health” booklet that tracks their child’s weight and vaccinations. Some walk very long distances to be sure that their children are growing and thriving.

Medfy, a member of the Sinkhani community health worker team, is currently the only one in her area. Like the mothers, she walks over four miles for the weighing day, helping the children up to the scale and writing their weights on tiny hands before they head over to have them written on their charts. Medfy supports two government

Health Surveillance Assistants (HSAs), Eunice and Deacon, as they update booklets, counsel mothers, and provide vaccinations. This team of three will spend most of the day with the mothers and children, before walking home in the dusk light.



For over a decade, the Sinkhani have prioritized weighing days like these. A small area, like Champeta, may see 50-75 mothers, while a weighing day in a larger community might be attended by over 150 mothers (many bringing more than one child)! In partnering with government HSAs, Sinkhani volunteers like Medfy provide essential support to communities as they work to protect their children from malnutrition, stunting, and transmissible diseases. By preventing illnesses and identifying risk factors early on, families can thrive!

# A New Generation of Leaders

In October 2022, the volunteer community health workers from Gorkha, Rai, and Kathmandu, Nepal, gathered for their first training since 2019. Coordinator Pinkey helped to facilitate, joined by site coordinator Ramprasad, site coordinator and professional nurse Sangeeta, and nursing students Pabitra, Nikita, and Sara. Sangeeta and all three nursing students have been recipients of the nursing scholarships administered by HealthEd Connect. This team of six helped to refresh the volunteers on World Health Organization community-based care practices and led a new training module about women's health. The facilitators also explored topics of aging populations, pre and post-natal care, and the Dengue fever crisis affecting Nepal at the

time. A similar training will take place in Biratnagar, so the volunteers in that area can also benefit from these classes.

This partnership of volunteer community health workers and professional (or future professional) nurses is exciting! This is empowerment and advocacy in action; local trainers like Ramprasad, Pinkey, and Sangeeta speak and understand the local language,

culture, and issues, and they are preparing the next generation of trainers like Pabitra, Sara, and Nikita by involving them as facilitators.

Since access to education or health services may be limited in the communities served by volunteer health workers, training provides pathways for women to become better educated, more confident, and involved in their communities in a big way!

# Keeping Up in Kikungu

In the Kikungu village of D.R. Congo, there's great excitement! After a generous gift of land from village chiefs, the Wasaidizi health workers and Kikungu community members joined together to build a community center to serve orphans and vulnerable children and caregivers. Literacy education, health classes, infant/child monitoring, and skill building are among the programs planned.

After a traditional groundbreaking ceremony, the group encountered their first major obstacle: the truck hired to transport bricks to the site could not pass over the dike. Seeing that this could mean significant delays in construction, women in the community volunteered to carry the heavy blocks! One woman bent down while the others stacked the blocks on her head, and then walked nearly a mile to

the build site where volunteers unloaded the blocks. Then they turned around and did it over again!

Thanks to their hard work, the community center walls went up in a matter of days! After the roof was framed and the floors prepared, only final touches remain like plaster and paint. All of this was accomplished by hand in just a few months! One of the project coordinators, Musans, wrote: ***"The Kikungu center is an event of the century...[The community says] a miracle is done in Kikungu... to show their joy, everyone who visits the works contributes with [their] strength...the children, young people and parents."***

Community centers like these are only possible thanks to teamwork from community members, coordinators, and supporters like you!





# Seeing Double

**E**xciting developments are happening at our three sister schools in Zambia! As a grassroots-led organization, it's important that our direction comes from local leaders, the ones working in the field to empower women and children.

In 2021, our sister school and Kafwa leaders held a roundtable meeting to discuss how the Girls Achievement Program (GAP) and Keeping in Touch (KIT) programs might move forward. Two main ideas were brought up: first, there was a need for additional scholarships for orphans and vulnerable children to continue their education through high school. Second, the KIT program would need to be expanded, to ensure that scholarship recipients would be supported academically, socially, and emotionally. They advocated for their students' educational future, and we were happy to follow their advice!

Starting in 2022, we **DOUBLED** the number of high school scholarships! In prior years, each school

selected five girls and one boy from the seventh grade class to continue on to secondary school. Now, each school selects ten girls and two boys to join the proud ranks of scholars! The KIT program has also been expanded, resulting in the hiring of KIT Coordinators based at each of our three sister schools. These coordinators lead tutoring, communicate with students' teachers and caregivers, and facilitate KIT Club meetings. They also help to monitor each student's academic progress, ensure 'after-hours' access to the computer lab and library, and support extracurricular activities with fellow teachers and Kafwa volunteers.

It takes a team to make huge programmatic changes like this, and to support students as they work hard to achieve their high school diplomas. Teachers, Kafwa, KIT Coordinators, and YOU, all uplift the education and empowerment of youth!

# Gardening for Good

**C**ommunity gardens at schools and community centers sponsored by HealthEd Connect are lovingly tended by volunteer health workers. The fruits (and greens) of their labor are shared with those in the community who most need the nutritious foods to survive and thrive. These efforts are critical, as much of the world is experiencing increasing levels of hunger. The UN Secretary stated, “hunger remains deeply entrenched and is rising”. He highlighted that over the past five years, tens of millions of people have joined the ranks of the chronically undernourished.\*

Considering the impact of a global pandemic and current trends, Africa has been hit the hardest and the situation is worsening. In 2020, 19 percent of its people were undernourished. If current trends continue, Africa will be home to more than half of

the world’s chronically hungry by 2030\*. HealthEd Connect volunteer health workers routinely report on the hunger and food scarcity they encounter daily and have indicated an eagerness to expand their gardening efforts.

Thanks to a generous response at our 2022 “Springing Anew” benefit concert, we were able to support this goal and provide enough funds to build three garden sheds (plus more towards a 4th) to support important nutrition programs in Malawi and Zambia! Our health workers do an excellent job of educating caregivers about nutrition to promote children’s growth and development, but without food, the knowledge cannot be applied. Teaching people how to increase food production in order to provide beneficial nutrients to their families takes the next step.

The gardens in Kazomba, Malawi, serve as an outdoor classroom, where women learn how to grow subsistence gardens at their homes as well as develop larger co-op community gardens. In Mulundu, Zambia, the garden shed will house crops from their expansive farming area after the 2023 harvest! The shed and gardens at the Matete community center in Malawi will store seeds, tools, and excess crops to be used and shared with children and families over time.

We’re feeling joyful, knowing that the overwhelming generosity of supporters and the hard work and dreams of our friends have resulted in the space and resources needed to grow nutritious food that will help reduce malnutrition and stunting in children. Women, children, and families’ lives will be uplifted through these expanded gardening efforts!
